

BROOMBALL COVID-19 PLAN

VENUE/GAME PLAY

- There will be no more than 12 people allowed on the ice at a time as broomball is a game played 6v6.
- Each team will have a designated team space and door to enter the ice rink.
- There will be no handshaking before or after the game.
- Game times will have a 30-minute intermission to limit the team to team contact and allow for sanitizing of shared equipment.
- Flexible cancellation and make-up date so that if participants start experiencing symptoms, they can cancel.
- Hand sanitizer & disinfecting wipes will be provided at each event.

COMPETITORS

- There will be no more than 12 people allowed on the ice at a time as broomball is a game played 6v6. Each team will have a designated team space and door to enter the ice rink.
- There will be no handshaking before or after the game.
- Game times will have a 30-minute intermission to limit the team to team contact and allow for sanitizing of shared equipment.
- Flexible cancellation and make-up date so that if participants start experiencing symptoms, they can cancel.
- Hand sanitizer & disinfecting wipes will be provided at each event.
- Participants will stay home if sick or exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms.
- Participants who have been in close contact with a person suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19 will not participate.
- Contact information will be provided by participants prior to league participation and will be kept with the commissioner for each team.
- Attendance will be taken at each event to help with potential exposure notification.

CDC GUIDANCE ON MASK USAGE DURING HIGH-INTENSITY ACTIVITIES*

- Masks should be used in public settings, but if you are unable to wear a mask because of difficulty breathing during high-intensity activities, choose a location with greater ventilation and air exchange (for instance, outdoors versus indoors) and where you can keep at least 6 feet from others during the activity.
- If you are able to wear a mask, remove your mask if it gets moist from sweat and replace it with a clean mask.
- Opt for an activity that does not require using mouth guards or helmets. Wearing a mask with these types of protective equipment is not safe if it makes it hard to breathe.
